Debbie is Retiring!

Although Board Members of MTCC690 knew that this day was coming, the announcement from Debbie in the Fall of 2021 that she would like to retire, brought home the realisation that we would be losing a very experienced Condo Manager - one who is knowledgeable about all aspects of our building and who makes our positions easier. This would be hard to replicate – and

as you will see in this newsletter, it took the Board several months to ensure a successful result in our search for new Management.

The only member of our staff in position longer than Debbie is our concierge Michael, who remembers when Debbie started her Manager role here in October of 1988. What Michael may not

fully appreciate is that Debbie had already reviewed or interviewed *all the existing staff* in order to decide who would stay and who would be replaced! Working as Manager at the prestigious mid-town condo 70 Rosehill at the time, Debbie clearly had already developed the ability to identify good concierge potential! She was hired for 211 Queens Quay West from 70 Rosehill – the story being that an influential owner, frustrated by the inability of the board to find a suitable manager told them to "Get in the car and drive to the most comparable condo building and see the manager." At the time, 70 Rosehill was one of a few comparable to 211 Queens Quay – and the rest is history!

Very shortly after taking the Condo Manager position at 211 Queens Quay, Debbie made the bold business decision to incorporate and started her own company DJS Management Inc. – this at a time when there were not

> many condo management companies. By 1988 she had several years of management experience under her belt and found that her management philosophy did not always agree with that of the large umbrella management corporations for whom she worked. **"I had my own** format" and **"I worked for** the owners and

residents". She kept things manageable by never having more than three condominium buildings at a time in her portfolio. Initially the three buildings were Marina del Rey, Rosedale Glen and 211 Queens Quay. Later, The Ports at 1177 Yonge Street replaced Marina del Rey – and in recent years Debbie has put all her efforts into MTCC690 at 211 Queens Quay.

Undoubtedly our excellent teams of concierges and cleaning staff developed by Debbie have been a major factor in the success of our building over the years.



Debbie recounts that all staff she hires are word of mouth referrals from her extensive network of contacts. Networking clearly works! When asked how Debbie has been so successful in maintaining the staff, the concierges variously report that Debbie is "likeable", "very personable", "always positive and cheerful", "takes a personal interest" and "encourages". Further she "knows how to deal with people" "doesn't take sides", "only brings legitimate complaints", "knows everything", "treats us well" and "does not act like a Boss!" Alba Graner of AG Interior Design Inc., who has worked with Debbie on several design projects at our building, including the major renovation of the elevator halls and corridors, the refresh of the pool area and the face-lift of the entrance lobby has said "She is a jewel to work with she is the most positive and helpful individual which makes my job so much easier."

In conclusion, Debbie's considerable experience over more than 40 years in the industry and her 34 years working in this building will be a great loss. Her detailed knowledge of our building has meant it has been well maintained and she devoted herself to making life positive for the residents and owners by being accessible, helpful and cooperative. She has also provided invaluable assistance to the Board. When asked what she will most miss Debbie answered "The people, many of whom I have known for years and some even from the beginning". What will she not miss? "Being 'on' all the time, with little opportunity to be off email and phone." Well, very soon she will be able to be "off" whenever she wants! We all wish Debbie a long, healthy, exciting and well-deserved retirement!

A New Chapter

The Process

From the moment on September 10,2021 when your Board learned of Debbie Shaver's retirement, we have been in constant communication through dozens of meetings, hundreds of e-mails and a limited number of in-person meetings.

The objective was to make the transition to a new condominium manager as smooth and trouble-free as possible.

From the outset we identified certain non negotiable criteria:

- A seamless transition regarding our owners and our loyal employees
- We wanted a full time manager
- The individual would have strong inter-personal and communication skills
- He/she would be a Registered Condominium Manager (RCM), licenced by the Condomunium Management Regulatory Authority of Ontario (CMRAO) and certified by the Association of Condominium Managers of Ontario (ACMO)
- The individual would have 10 years experience in a comparable setting
- And would have access to a network of suppliers

Quickly the Board members realized that we did not have the knowledge nor expertise to undertake such an executive search. We chose to hire a consultant to guide us through the process. After receiving proposals from three consultants and completing interviews, we chose Beredan Management and Consulting and their managing partner Robert Buckler mid November.

His mandate included 16 action items and a schedule to have the new property manager in place for April 1, 2022. One of the activities was a 360 internal analysis where he would meet employees, owners, Northam and other stakeholders to validate our assumptions. The result of this study is an Organisational Analysis Report, a vital tool as we moved forward.

Ten established, proven, condominium management companies were invited to quote on our detailed Request for Proposal. Nine accepted to visit the premises for a guided tour. Mid February we analysed formally the eight proposals that had been received and at month end we short listed four who we met in person.

Early in March, unanimously, your board and Robert Buckler chose 360 Community Management Ltd.

With the support of Audrey Loeb of Shibley Righton LLP a new two year Management Services Agreement was negotiated and we turned next to the selection of an experienced Condominium Manager meeting our profile as defined above. And in early April, once again by unanimous agreement, we selected Odette Fuentes-Theodosiou.

It has been a busy eight months but we can certainly be most satisfied with the diligence and professionalism of all concerned.

What will Change and What Won't

Our objective is that our community will see only positive changes in the coming months and years.

The official hand-over was May 1, 2022. Condominium fee payments and payroll will be managed by Debbie for this month end. All future transactions will be managed by 360.

There will be no change in personnel, beyond the arrival of Odette. She will be on site a minimum of three days a week, and of course available five days a week. 360 offers around the clock support in the event of emergencies.

360 offers us a panoply of new services, from an improved web presence, a deep knowledge of the condominium industry, a broad skill set regarding technical, legal and commercial issues and enhanced communication platforms for our community. One of these platforms is a dedicated internet based communication with our concierges.

In summary, our expectation is that going forward, the management of our condominium corporation will be handled in an even more professional and contemporary fashion


Odette Fuentes-Theodosiou

Regardless of the many changes within our community, some things never change. There will always be the need for continued maintenance and 2022 is no exception.


The largest and most visible project is the continuation of the solarium refurbishments. 
